The Academy of Information Technology (AOIT), an award-winning National Academy Foundation program, provides students with opportunities to study computer science, programming, database administration, web design, and other areas in the expanding digital workplace. The Class of 2022 had seven National Merit Scholarship finalists and earned almost six million dollars in scholarships.

Covid-19 Information

Grading for the Spring semester of the 2019-2020 School Year

Per North Carolina State Board of Education <u>Policy GRAD-009</u>, students in grades 9-11 during the 2019-20 school year were provided two options for final grades: Numeric grades or a PC19 or WC19. Numeric grades reflect the highest grade representing learning as of March 13, 2020, or as improved through the semester as remote learning continued. PC19 represents a passing grade and a full credit towards graduation; WC19 represents a lack of evidence of mastery in the course and indicates that the school is unable to award a full credit. Numeric grades are factored into the GPA and class rank; PC19 and WC19 grades are not.

Scheduling During the 2020-2021 School Year

Due to Wake County Public Schools' decision to create a Virtual Academy within our school, some courses were limited for our students during the 2020-21 school year. Students could choose Virtual Academy for the fall semester or for the entire year.

Scheduling During the 2021-2022 School Year

Wake County Public Schools (WCPSS) made the decision to create a Virtual Academy option through the district for students during this year. Students had to opt into the Virtual Academy for the entire 2021-2022 school year. Students within the Virtual Academy took a combination of classes from WCPSS teachers throughout the district and North Carolina Virtual Public Schools (NCVPS).
